Academic requirements

Degree or PhD in Medicine or in Biomedical Sciences

Required Experience: Research laboratory experience in the use of animal models, preferably in relation to the study of:

- 1) Mechanisms of neurodegeneration, OR
- 2) Early diagnosis and treatment of dementia

Language: Applicants should be fluent in English

Supporting documentation

Curriculum Vitae Including extract of academic degree, study field(s), and research interests

Publications: Research articles in peer-reviewed scientific journals

Research projects: Participation in research projects, especially in relation to the use of experimental models for neurodegeneration, or in translational or clinical research in neurodegeneration/dementia.

OBJECT: Funding in each case will be for a 6-month period with the possibility of extension for a further 6 months. Successful applicants will participate in the research program of the Pathology and Psychiatry Department, Alzheimer's Disease Center at the NYU School of Medicine, NY.

Successful applicants will thus have outstanding opportunities to interact with the multidisciplinary research program of the reputed Alzheimer's Disease Center of the NYU.

Period: October 1, 2008 – March 30, 2009

Requirements: 1) Curriculum vitae
2) Statement of research interests
3) Letters of reference

Requirement upon completion of stay: Research report of activities carried out during the stay

Total amount: 16.000 €

Remuneration will be made as follows:

85%: As an advance payment for the first six months.

15%: Upon delivery of the final research report

Board of examiners: Evaluation of candidates will be carried out by a panel consisting of the Scientific Director of the ADRU and two persons appointed by FIS.
